

## I WAS A PILOT FOR THE MOB




A young thrill seeking junkie finds himself addicted to the thrills of combat and living on the edge.

What happens when violence gets into your DNA and you begin to crave it like a drug? *I Was a Pilot for the Mob* by David Samuels explores how the seeds of rage plant themselves into one man, and what happens when they grow and bear fruit.

Daniel is a young man when he goes off to fight in the perilous jungles of Vietnam, and engages in life or death battles for his country. During his missions as a helicopter gunship pilot, he quickly becomes addicted to the thrills and life-or-death challenges of living on the edge in combat. But when he returns home to America, he can't adjust to the sudden peace and quiet, or to the many rules he is supposed to now live by. Instead of the heady adrenaline of his life always being on the line, he starts feeling suffocated by the safety and comfort of the average day-to-day existence. Instead of heart-pounding suspense of whether this day will be his last, he is faced with boredom and routine. While the feeling of being invincible had served him well in the military, it makes civilian life a living hell. But when he tries to talk about his need for danger, he's scorned or misunderstood, and he begins to feel cut off from most of society. Soon, to his surprise, he's drawn to the only group that will have him - and understand him - the Mob. Organized crime offers him a way to feed his dark and dangerous addiction, and while society mocks his need for thrills, the Mob embraces it. Even better, the Mob handsomely rewards Daniel for his willingness to push himself to his limits - and beyond. But what happens when he begins to reach the point of no return? The deeper he gets involved, the more

Daniel comes to realize that there are many different kinds of justice in the world, and that even with the benefits he has experienced, mob justice has some very dangerous drawbacks, but he likes it!

Brilliantly written and pulsing with thrills, *I Was a Pilot for the Mob* is an action thriller that's sure to appeal to fans of James Patterson and John Grisham. "I want readers to get a different perspective on the many kinds of justice that our society has spawned," says Samuels. "The justice systems of today are broken and I want to show how previously untouchable people can be held accountable for their actions."

Samuels himself grew up in the northeast and joined the Army during the Vietnam War. He became a helicopter gunship pilot and was awarded the Silver Star for gallantry in action. Later in his life, he was a pilot for a large corporation. His life experiences give this novel both a startling authenticity and texture that can't be faked.

A stunning portrait of mob life in the Northeast during the 60s and 70s, as well as the horrors of the Vietnam conflict, *I Was a Pilot for the Mob* is a stunning debut about a man who saw violence, lived it, and was finally able to walk away.
