NORTH MIAMI, Fla. - Based on factual places and events, *In the Sanctity of the Snake Pit* (<u>published by AuthorHouse</u>), the new novel by Michael D. Written in the style of narrative non-fiction, *In the Sanctity of the Snake Pit* provides a rare account of air to ground combat. The protagonist, Mitchell Collins, is a repairman for the helicopters of the 135th Assault Helicopter Unit, a fighting contingency made up of Royal Australian personnel and members of the U.S. Army. As the only multi-national experimental military unit in Vietnam, the unit maintained "the highest order of discipline" and "wrought devastation of the Viet Cong in South Vietnam's delta region," Guard writes.

When Mitchell decides that his true desire is to fly in the helicopters he was trained to repair, he is transformed into an aerial combatant on his unit's elite Taipan platoon flying helicopter gunships. Their mission is to protect the troop transport choppers carrying ground forces into the fight, providing gun support and reconnaissance once the troops are in the landing zone.

In the Sanctity of the Snake Pit shows that Mitchell's experiences were unlike those of combatants who fought on the ground. "The intensity and frequency of actions were multiplied by their mobility," Guard explains. Mitchell contemplates his own mortality after facing carnage and losing comrades. As his yearlong duty continues, his chances for survival dwindle.
